From My Window

Students will view a variety of works from the permanent collection of the Dixon Gallery and Gardens and discuss times of day represented in the artwork. Then, students will create their own spinning window that can show a changing view of their own creation.

- 1. First, students will decorate a paper plate with two landscapes, one during the day and one at night.
- 2. Students will then lay their second paper plate on top of their decorated plate. The second plate will have a rectangle cut out prior to the class.
- 3. With instructor help, students will poke a brad through both plates to allow them to spin.
- 4. Finally, students will decorate their top plate like a window and an interior room of a house.

DISCUSSION



About the museum: The Dixon Gallery and Gardens is a fine art museum and public garden founded in 1976. American and French Impressionism make up the majority of the museum's permanent collection. Each year, the Dixon organizes and presents eight to ten art exhibits designed to appeal to all ages and showcase a variety of artistic styles.

Guiding questions:

How can artists show that it is daytime in their artwork? How can artists show that it is nighttime in their artwork? What colors could you use to represent a sunset? A Sunrise? What is a landscape? Are there any other styles of art?
